- Flint Hill operates on a semester calendar.
- We utilize a 4.0 grading scale and calculate a weighted GPA, with honors courses earning +0.33 and AP® courses earning +0.67.
- We do not rank students.
- Placement in AP® and Honors classes is at the discretion of the faculty and academic dean.
- 25 Advanced Placement® courses are offered; students enrolled in AP® courses are required to sit for the exam.

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS AND MATRICULATION

- On average, our students apply to 8 colleges.
- 26.8% of the Class of 2024 applied and enrolled under an Early Decision I/II program.
- 100% of our students typically matriculate directly to four-year colleges.

SCIENCE RESEARCH SCHOLARS PROGRAM AND INDEPENDENT STUDY

RESEARCH SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Started in the 2023-24 school year, the Research Scholars Program allows curious and self-motivated students to develop a scientific question in consultation with the science department chair and a faculty advisor. The goal of the program is for the student to create a challenging experience — which could result in failure — that reflects a personal intellectual interest and that will require significant time and effort to explore. The small number of students who participate in the program will work independently on their research during non-class/school hours. Additionally, students may pursue their study over multiple semesters or academic years depending on the nature of their project and/or their results. Participants will defend their question in front of a faculty panel, presenting a poster of their findings and responding to questions from the committee. Students named as Research Scholars will receive a notation on their official transcript.

INDEPENDENT STUDY

Coordinated by Flint Hill's Academic Dean and offered through our Innovation Department, students may propose and design a semester-long independent study. In some cases, students choose to complete an independent study because they have completed all of our course offerings in a specific field. In other cases, they have a particularly strong interest in a field in which we don't offer course work. Either way, the program requires students to be proactive and independently motivated. There is a student-designed, defined goal for the experience with regular required check-ins to ensure they are making appropriate progress. Our Academic Dean reviews the student's work at the end of the term, conferring a grade and credit based on their evaluation of the student's oral feedback and written documentation of their study. Sample topics of current and past independent study programs are: Study in Abstract Algebra, Study in Post-Colonial Literature, Audio Circuit Design, Entomology, Political Culture of France, Statistical Base Math Modeling, Vergil's Eclogues, Topics in French Literature, Immigration and Integration, and Sociology & Gender Studies.

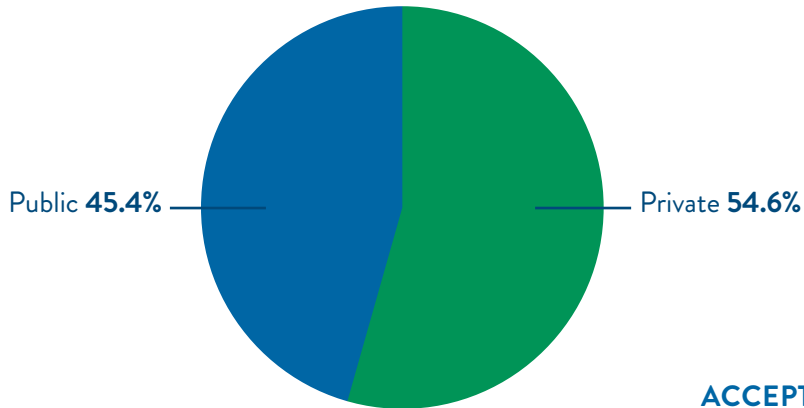

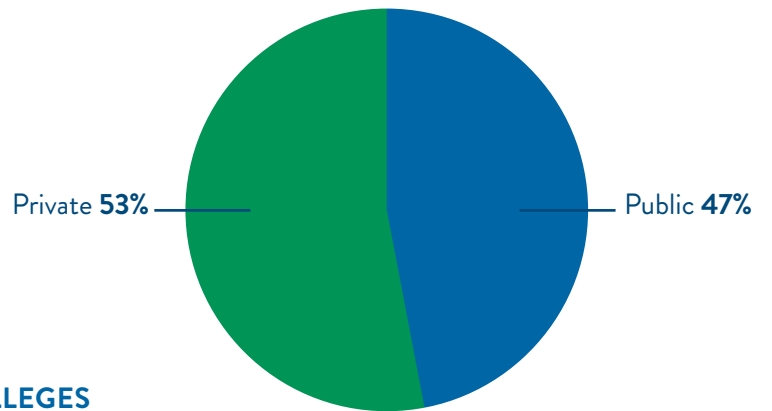

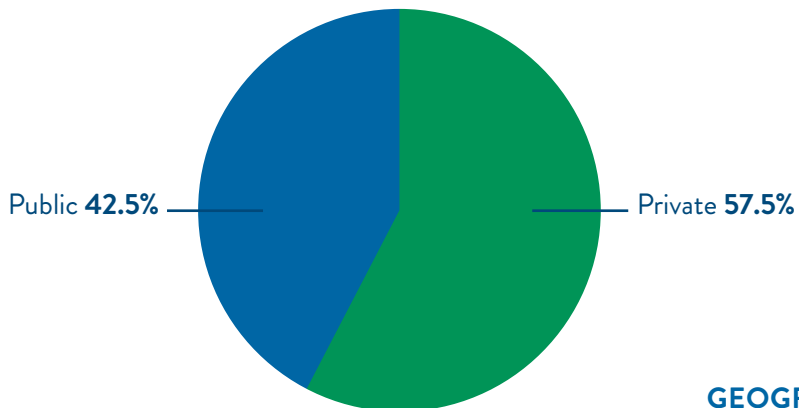
APPLICATIONS TO PUBLIC VS. PRIVATE COLLEGES
